Each week you must complete one activity from one box on the grid. Homework books are to be handed in **EVERY** Tuesday morning.

<p>Create a crossword puzzle about the Victorians. You need at least 5 questions across and 5 questions down. Can a member of your family complete the answers?</p>	<p>The Penny Black stamp was first used in 1840. Design your own stamp or set of stamps.</p>	<p>Draw a family tree for Queen Victoria; showing her parents, grandparents and her children. It should also show their dates of birth and death. Decorate the family tree carefully.</p>
<p>Write a diary entry in the role of a work house child. What is life like for you? How do you feel? What would you write in your diary?</p>	<p>Find out how long Kings and Queens of the past have reigned and make a bar chart to compare with Queen Victoria's reign. Don't forget to label your chart!</p>	<p>Imagine you are travelling back in time to visit the Victorians. Draw pictures or make models of objects you would take to show them that are important to our time and put them in a time capsule you made!</p>
<p>Find a painting by a famous artist created during the Victorian period 1837-1901. The artist doesn't have to be British! Create your own version of the painting using materials of your choice.</p>	<p>Using books or the internet, find out about Victorian food. With a friend or member of your family, choose a recipe and make it! What was it like? Did you like it? Did your family like it? Write a brief evaluation of your dish!</p>	<p>Write your own song based on a Victorian one and add your own music/sounds.</p>
<p>With the help of your family, draw and create your own family tree! Who will you include? Decorate your family tree carefully.</p>	<p>Plan and design the inside of a Victorian dolls house.</p>	<p>Create a 'Victorians' homework of your own choice that is not on the homework grid. Remember to give it a date, title and make it great!</p>
